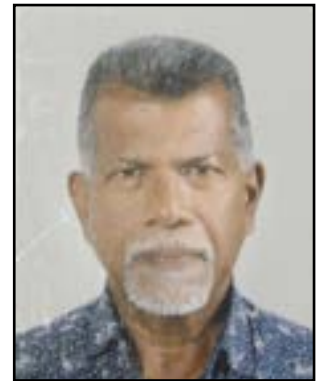

A TRIBUTE TO THE LATE
Krishan Singh



To an amazing schoolmate, colleague, comrade, brother and friend - Krishan Singh s/o late Jeswant Singh.

Words cannot express the void he has left in our hearts and the hockey communities that he had nurtured and championed.

A Taiping boy, Krishan started his hockey journey from a young age in his hometown. He played hockey in St George's Institution, Taiping and thereafter Taiping District and graduated to the Perak State team. He demonstrated much passion for the game and inspired many young talents along the way. He was the goalkeeper with the Taiping Sikhs, till he left for work in Kuala Lumpur.

Where ever his life journey took him, he would embrace the hockey communities there, while making that leap in growth and achievement. He has touched many lives on and off the field. Often travelling by train and sleeping at the railway station in the wee hours for the match at Ipoh Padang. This is just a glimpse of his dedication, passion and commitment to hockey.

In Kuala Lumpur, Krishan played for the Sikh Gurney Police team in Aman Club and Klang. Thereafter, he represented KL Veterans in various tournaments throughout the country. Krishan played for the Malaysian Veteran's Team in the World Cup Masters Hockey in Canberra in 2016.

In October 2022, despite his job commitments, he answered the last-minute call a few days before the World Cup Grand Masters in Tokyo as a replacement goalkeeper. Krishan was voted as one of the best goalkeepers of that tournament assisting Malaysia in winning the bronze medal. This podium finish is the highest achievement by any Malaysian hockey team in all international age groups and categories. Little did we know, that this was to be his final match.

It is tough to imagine, not having him on our next match on the turf. It wouldn't be the same anymore. We wish his family strength and courage to face the days ahead. Memories of our hockey days with him, will always be etched in our hearts. Rest in peace dear Krishan. We miss you.

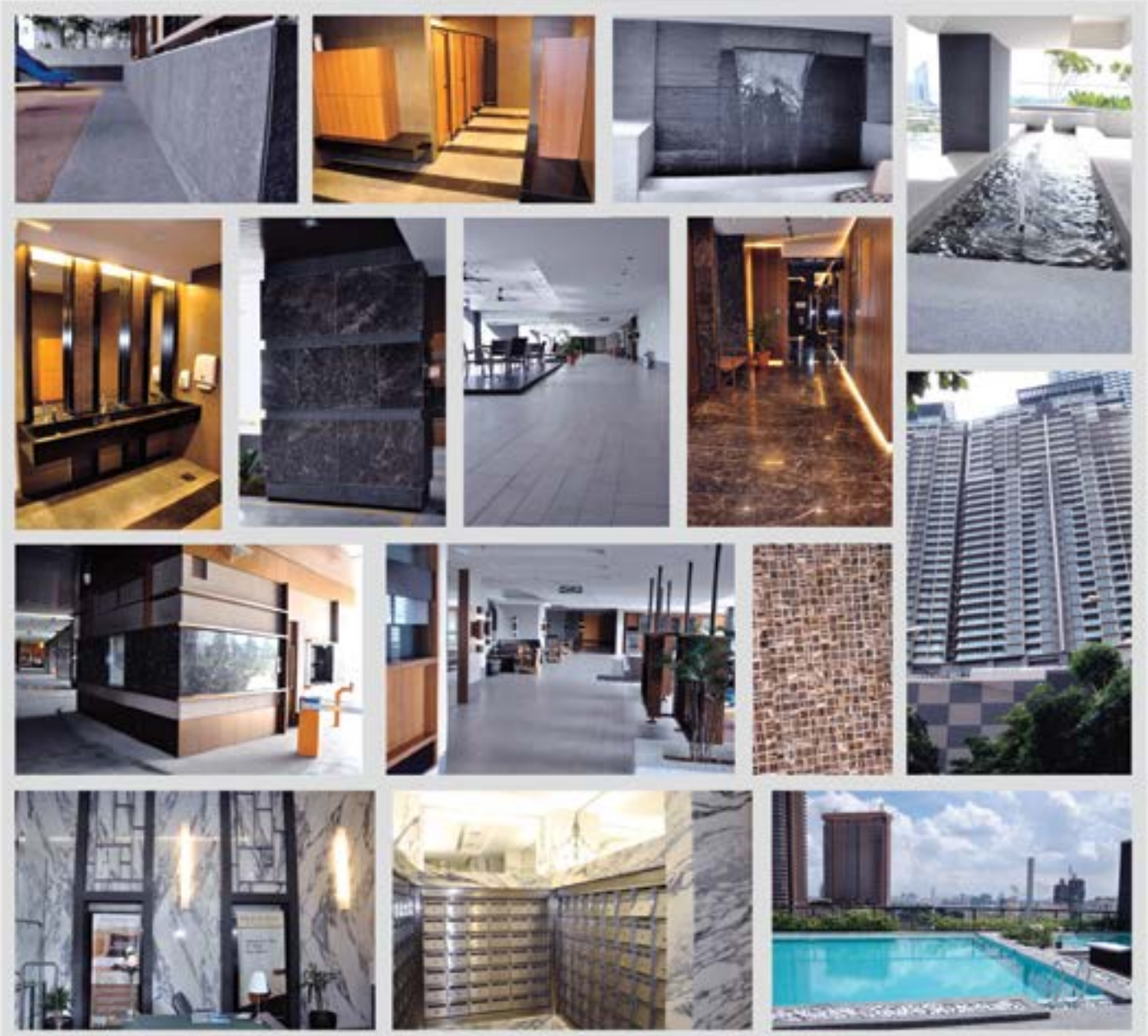

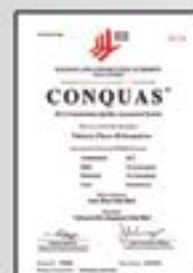

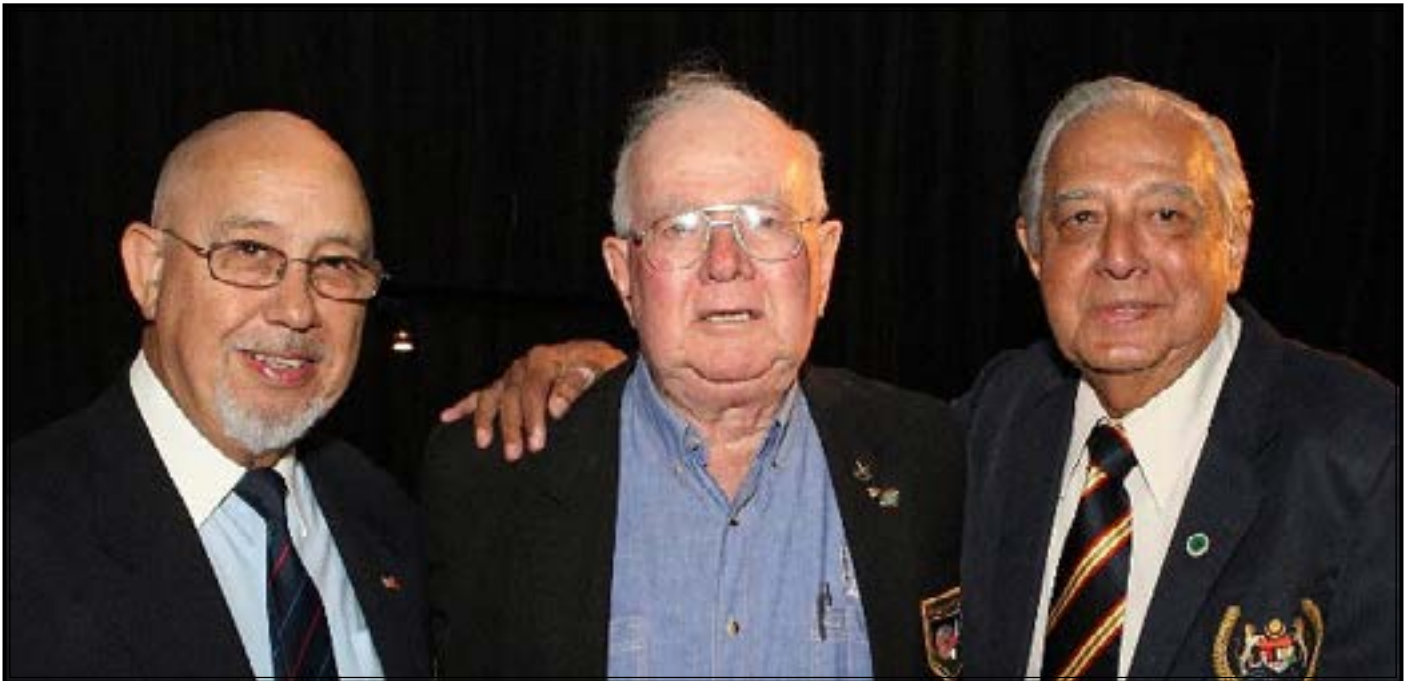

Minnows show intent

THE outside ranked teams showed great form over the weekend in the curtain raiser of the Junior Hockey League.

While big guns in Division One rested (their players were involved in the Asian Schools tournament in India), the minnows used the opportunity to make their mark.

In Division One, Johor Juniors were the revelation while Universiti Kuala Lumpur (UniKL) showed composure to triumph.

In Division Two, Malaysian Indian Sports and Cultural Foun-

dation-Universal Fitness & Leisure (MISCF-UFL) showed great form which surprised the gallery.

The girls' JHL saw last season's champions SSTMI Thunderbolts edge silver medallists KL Wipers 1-0 to set up the start of another close season.

Johor Juniors were down twice, but came back to draw 2-2 and then beat seasoned JHL side Old La Sallians Association of Klang (Olak) Nur-insafi 3-2 on shootout.

Olak have been playing in the JHL since their debut in 1995

and even joined hands with Nurinsafi this season to strengthen their side, but underdogs Johor Juniors sealed two crucial points.

Five of Olak-Nurinsafi's players recently played in Division One of the Malaysia Hockey League and after a 3-3 draw, lost the gold medal to Police 3-1 in a shootout. Determination saw experience thrown out of the window.

In Division Two, MISCF-UFL trained for two months, only on weekends, and had a one week camp in Kuala Selangor but almost claimed the scalp of Terengganu Juniors.

MISCF-UFL took the lead, which shocked the gallery, but caved in during the last 15 min-

utes due to inexperience. It was their first tournament match as an outfit, but showed promise of a better season.

Veterans ready for the battle

Malaysian over-40s, over-50s teams face tough challenge at Masters Hockey World Cup in Australia

MALAYSIA will be sending three teams to play under various age-groups in the Masters Hockey World Cup in Canberra, Australia from tomorrow to April 5.

The over-40s team captained by Savinder Singh Gill and the over-50s squad headed by former national team skipper Sarjit Singh, will be vying for honours against some of the best veteran hockey teams in the world.

The over-60s team will play in the tournament to be held at Newcastle, Australia from May 2 to 13.

All three teams will be playing under the banner of the Sultan Ahmad Shah Hockey Association (SASHA).

The over-40s and over-50s teams wrapped up their last training match at the Pantai Education

grounds where they were having passing drills and practising their penalty corners.

SASHA president Tan Sri Mustafa Maruzar said Malaysia has been sending teams for the event since its inception.

He believed that the teams were better prepared this time.

"We have had some good practice playing in a number of friendly matches but I think the main difference is that the players are fitter since we started training the last three months," he said.

Mustafa said Malaysia's over-40s side once emerged champions in Brunei and secured several runner-up finishes. The over-50s side has finished runner-up once.

The over-40s competition, which will be played in a round-robin format, comprises Australia, the UK, the US, New Zealand, Malaysia and club side, Barbarians.

The over-50s event will feature Germany, the UK, Australia, the US, New Zealand, South Africa and Malaysia.

Given the depth of the opposing sides, Mustafa expects a tough competition.

"Countries like Australia, Germany and the UK play hockey throughout the year," he said.

On their preparations, coach James Murthy, who is an ex-international, said, "We started with physical training, team-building, tactics, and for the final phase, short corner and short corner defence."

James said he had to use a different formation, 4-4-2 from the back, in view of the tough opposition.

"When we take into account playing with teams like Australia, New Zealand and the UK, who are the best teams, we have to use a different system compared to our previous 3-3-1 or 4-4-2 from

the front," he said.

"Within the system, certain players are given certain responsibilities and whenever we lose the ball we have more players to counter."

He said the formation was working because players understood their roles easily, judging by the way they played in some of the friendlies.

Still, he said, performances had to be gauged.

"We will have to wait and see

how we do. I cannot expect too much from the over-40s side as this is the first time they are playing after a lapse of 15 years," he added.

James hoped that future players could be partly sponsored to ensure a better selection for such meets.

"Right now because we all pay and travel, many (top) players don't travel with us. If the SASHA or other bodies could subsidise expenses, these players could take part," he said.
